

Ann Price's inventory was made on 20 May 1821. In addition to other possessions, enslaved people and their appraised and "real" values were listed. Ann Price's goods & chattels were sold at an auction on 15 October 1821 on credit. Thomas Moore was administrator of Ann Price's estate. He registered a bill on 20 Feb 1822. This excerpt summary of the bill shows who bought whom...

-The 1821 inventory lists 25 slaves - apparently 11 women or girls, 12 men or boys, and 2 children

-The 1822 sales show three or four slaves that were not sold. It also lists two to four slaves that were not listed in the 1821 inventory.
